"I still think of my College friends as being some of the smartest people I have ever met, and many of us were reliant on scholarships for our place at the school.



Scholarships

Importantly, College offers two types of scholarships. Ivy Scholarships are based on merit in academia and co-curricular areas. They are funded by the College.

Tower Scholarships designed to support families that prioritise the benefit of receiving a quality education but require financial assistance to make this dream a reality. Tower Scholarships are funded by the Foundation.

150 Club

In 2022, The Hamilton and Alexandra College celebrated its sesquicentenary anniversary and launched the 150 Club. Funds raised through this philanthropic group are dedicated to Tower Scholarships, supporting students who could not otherwise afford to attend College.

150 Club members donate \$100 per month for three years.

Bequests

A gift in your Will, known as a bequest, provides you with the opportunity to support The Hamilton and Alexandra College once your needs, and those of your loved ones have been met.
